概要 Summary	<p><Summary> This IEL will consist in the second session of our new GSDM Book Club, namely a regular gathering of GSDM students and faculty who, having agreed to read the same book, meet to discuss its main themes in the light of the GSDM goals. For this session, Peter Drucker's book "The Essential Drucker" has been chosen as the text participants will have to read. The IEL is opened by an explanation of the Book Club by Professor Yarime, who kindly agreed to participate to this session of the book club, then the particular book of the evening will be summarised by one or more students, followed by a debate. <p>Impressions /Comments</p>	<p>This book club session consisted in a brief introduction kindly produced by Professor Yarime on the point of innovation and management techniques, where the work of Peter Drucker is considered as a standard reference. Professor Yarime illustrated some of the intellectual roots of Drucker’s vision, particularly by linking it back to Joseph Schumpeter and his work on the importance of entrepreneurship and the nature of innovation processes in capitalism, such as “creative destruction” and “dynamic competition”.</p> <p>The discussion has then been opened with the involvement of all participants. Drucker’s book has been discussed with regard with the method of his work, which reflects a way of theorising, with little empirical backing, which would be seen today as rather unusual. However, Drucker was certainly a brilliant thinker as saw the importance of the human element, and the centrality of education for the success of business and other organisations. Besides, he underscored the importance of continuous innovation, demographic trends, and the ethical dimension of management.</p> <p>This book club session was particularly useful in envisaging some of the core problem of leadership as management, and its relation to innovation.</p>
