Impressions /Comments	<p>GSDM student committee requested the workshop, and Mr. Kumon kindly held the workshop for GSDM students.</p> <p>When we think about “global leadership”, it can be defined and explained in many forms. Sometimes the leadership is ambiguous because we start to consider that from a broad perspective.</p> <p>At the beginning of the workshop, Mr. Kumon represented how he had decided his career, what affected that decision, and how he exercised the leadership. This is an example of the process to analyze and understand our own “Being”, which may be defined as to know one’s self, through the deepening of self-awareness, values and beliefs. We usually try to define and explain the leadership by knowledge and skills, but what is most important is the “Being”.</p> <p>In the middle of the workshop, each group of two student presented their being and understood others from different background and cultures. It was not only a valuable opportunity to know other students, but also the moment to be aware of one’s self that would lead to new leadership.</p>
