1. Outline

This open workshop will be held as a supplemental event for a GSDM Platform Seminar named “Sciences behind the Decision Making for Conservation and Sustainable Development for World Ocean.” Natural resource governance and management is one of the global issues we need to discuss internationally in the recent century. For example, intergovernmental negotiations on formulating new convention about BBNJ (Biological Diversity Beyond National Jurisdiction) will begin in the United Nations from 2018. In the main seminar, international consensus building and related various academic challenges will be expected to be discussed. Then, based on the discussions from the main seminar, this open workshop will introduce 4 researchers, and they will present their different viewpoints on global natural resource governance. Participants are expected to discuss the future scope of international consensus building on ocean (or natural) resource governance from diversified perspectives so that they can learn empirical knowledge to conduct transdisciplinary research project while standing on their own academic research field.
