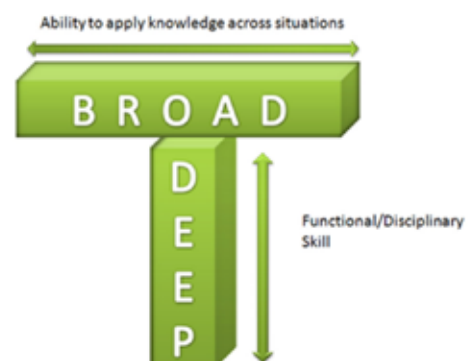
Questions to Dr. Dalton

Human Security and disaster diplomacy

- ‘do natural disasters induce international cooperation among countries that have traditionally been enemies? (Kelman and Koukis 2000: 214)
- A cooperative spirit induced by shared common efforts to deal with disasters may be able to overcome pre-existing prejudice and hatred? Rediscover common sense of humanity?
- ‘Hard’ power military assets often used in ‘soft’ power humanitarian assistance and disaster relief (HADR) missions
- Implications for foreign policy and security?

Sichuan earthquake 2008

- JDS *Sazanami* arrives in southern China on a relief mission
- first port of call for a Japanese warship in China since World War II



- Chinese state media broadcasts images of Japanese rescue team members shedding tears and bowing to the Chinese dead unearthed in the quake-hit area



US Operation *Tomodachi* after 3/11



Impact?

- Dec 2011 Annual Cabinet Office survey of public opinion on foreign affairs
- Record 82% felt friendly towards the US
- MOFA attributes this to the US relief operations
- USS Ronald Reagan off Tohoku coast
- America's 'dual use' military reach: for war and disaster relief (Kennedy 2005)



Super Typhoon Haiyan Nov 2013

- Headline: ‘Coke, Ikea give more to PH than China’ (Philippine Daily Inquirer picking up on an AFP report, 16 Nov 2013) also in British and American media
- “China, Asia’s rising power, is noteworthy for its stinginess.”- Patrick Cronin, *Foreign Policy*, 2013
- ‘Americans and Japanese proved all too eager to up the Chinese in their own *backyard*’- *Businessweek*, Nov 20, 2013

Japan by contrast



- Headline: ‘Japanese forces coming to PH to help’ on ABS-CBN News, Philippine news website, 12 November 2013
- ‘Japanese troops welcomed back in typhoon-hit Philippines’, (AFP 22 Nov 2013)
- Tente Quintero, 72, a former vice mayor of Tacloban, said a time of dispute with China over South China Sea was “happy” there were Japanese boots back on to help with disaster relief
- US and Japan ‘set the example and led the way’- Martin Hutchinson, *Reuters* analyst

Assets deployed

- About 1000 SDF members
- Includes major vessels such as helicopter destroyer *JS ISE*
- C130 transport and KC 767 refuelling tankers
- These are presented as 'normal' and desirable JSDF military behaviour, in contrast to Beijing's 'mismanagement' (Miller 2013)

Ebola outbreak 2014

- China sends elite Army medical team with experience of SARS outbreak in 2003
- Builds 100-bed treatment centre in Liberia
- US sends elite 101st Airborne Division to construct treatment units and train health workers
- UK sends army medics and naval vessel RFA Argus
- Japan sends transport plane with supplies but cancels plans to deploy ground forces
